IN THE GALLERIES:

Regen Projects presents new and ongoing work by

Andrea Zittel. Zittel continues her examination of "How to live?" and "What gives life meaning?" Through a variety of tactics, she focuses on social norms, values, and hierarchies as well as the creation of new systems and structures for living. This two-part exhibition embodies Zittel's evolving symbiosis between art object and active living environment and inaugurates the artist's newest permanent public installation in Joshua Tree, CA. Thru 8/12/17.

<u>Jason Vass Gallery</u> in downtown LA (by appointment only) presents "Unmade" with works by **Constance Mallinson.** Her scattered still lives are painted with a

style taken from the Old Masters with interjections of pure abstract gestures. The imagery is culled from natural and manufactured items collected by the artist on her daily walks. This fantastical assortment

shows our relationships with the environment and consumerism. "As Duchamp elevated common objects to the status of art, her images of degraded commodities situate us

once again in a provocative endgame." Runs 6/10-7/22/17.

"Embedded" at Lora Schlesinger Gallery features the work of Laura Karetsky that examines how we communicate in the digital age. She invites the viewer to consider perspective and the way information travels via text message, Face Time or social media. Having attended the artist talk on 6/3/17, I am certain you will find her paintings and videos smart, fresh and exquisitely executed. Thru 7/15/17.

"Reigning Cats and Dogs" is a solo exhibition by **Linsley Lambert** at <u>Avenue 50 Studio.</u> Runs 6/10-7/10/17.

"Hands at Work" at <u>Shoshana Wayne Gallery</u> features works by **Sabrina Gschwandtner.** Her studies of hands, craft and montage form the 11 quilts constructed from 16 mm film are presented in light boxes and a large-scale video that are on display. Thru 7/15/17.



<u>Craig Krull Galery</u> presents work by California artists **D.J. Hall** (image left) and **Jessie Homer**

French. Hall's iconic paintings of glamorous women provide a social commentary of our image-conscious culture. There is also a large tapestry on display and a new series of work called "The Riff Project" where archival pigment prints are mounted on plexiglas. **Jessie Homer French**'s delightful "Mapestries" focus on the many fault lines in Southern California in the Coachella Valley and Joshua Tree as well as the LA Basin. Her handembroidered maps are made from a variety of cloths and threads that resemble quilts. "French's work combines elements of traditional handicraft with a contemporary, environmental awareness and place-oriented sensibility.' Thru 7/2/17.



Lezley Saar's "Gender Renaissance" exhibition continues at Walter Maciel Gallery. From the LA Times review of 5/27/17: "The L.A. artist's surreal yet tender paintings of ambiguously gendered 19th century people were inspired by her son's transition from female to male, but they also scramble expectations about race and the very definition of humanity. Thru 6/24/17.

"POWER" is an intriguing exhibit at <u>Spruth Magers Gallery</u> that surveys the work of thirty leading African-American women artists from the 19th century to the present. It includes works by six WCA Lifetime Achievement Awardees including **Beverly Buchanan, Senga Nengundi, Lorraine O'Grady, Howardena Pindell, Faith Ringgold** and **Betye Saar** among other notable artists. Ends 6/10/17.

The <u>Landing Gallery</u> on West Jefferson hosts an equally intriguing group exhibition titled "Signifying Form" (image right) curated by **Jill Moniz**. It features highly narrative sculptural works by black female artists



made in Los Angeles between 1935 and 2016. It includes works by **Elizabeth Catlett**, **Samella Lewis, Betye Saar, Maren Hassinger, Senga Nengudi, Alison Saar**, **Dominique Moody, Beulah Woodard** and **Brenna Youngblood**. An Artist's Talk with **Alison Saar** is scheduled for Friday, 6/30/17 at 6:30 pm. Street parking is limited so check the gallery web site for parking tips or take the Metro. Thru 7/1/17.

Huntington Beach Art Center presents "Crossing Boundaries," the work of six feminist artists whose diverse works range from mixed media installations to fiber vessels. Artists include Sandy Abrams, Nicola Lamb, Connie DK Lane, Nancy Mooslin, Hiromi Takizawa and Carol Buck Vosburgh. Abrams creates

tightly woven fiber vessels that exploit the sculptural possibilities of the container. Lamb makes veils of color that shimmer and change with the light in her acrylic paintings on Plexiglas. Mixed-media artist Lane achieves an intriguing mix of abstraction and representation in her assemblages. Mooslin's work includes large-scale graphite and watercolor landscapes. Installations by Takizawa formally emphasize color, lines and light as exemplified in "Ultraviolet." Finally, there are mixed-media abstracted sculptures of branches situated as trophies by Vosburgh. Thru 7/01/17.

IN THE MUSEUMS:

The Craft and Folk Art Museum's "Keepin' It Clean" exhibition features Betye Saar's washboard assemblages. This series of washboard assemblage sculptures is an ongoing body of work Saar started in the late 1990s. The washboard is a powerful object used to examine the intersection of race, class, and labor. Two related tableaux and a selection of washboards from Saar's personal collection are also included in the exhibition. Thru 8/20/17.

"The Sky is a Great Space" at the <u>UCLA Hammer Museum</u> brings together five decades of work by **Marisa Merz**. She was the sole female protagonist of the Arte Povera circle of artists that emerged in Italy in the late 1960s and rejected Italy's material wealth in favor of "poor" materials. "Merz's challenging and evocative body of work, which is marked by great variety in scale and material that also deals with sexual and cultural difference. Thru 8/20/17.

I am intrigued with the upcoming exhibition at the <u>Getty Center titled</u> "Illuminating Women in the Medieval World." Women were not only represented frequently in manuscripts ranging from the Virgin Mary to damsels in distress, they also served as patrons and even as illuminators. Virtuous women, such as biblical heroines, steadfast saints and pious nuns were held up as models for proper behavior. In contrast evilminded women were warnings against sinful conduct. It will be fascinating to see the focus on the female in this display of illuminated manuscripts. Runs 6/20-9/17/17.

<u>The Norton Simon Museum</u> presents "Maven of Modernism: **Galka Scheyer** in California," an exhibition that delves into the life of the enterprising dealer. Thru 9/25/17.

"Los Angeles to New York: **Dwan** Gallery 1959-1971" is on view at <u>LACMA</u>. Watch this video to gain a better understanding of her impact on the art world: Los Angeles to New York: Dwan Gallery, 1959-1971. Thru 9/10/17.

<u>The Museum of Latin American Art</u> presents "**Frida Kahlo** through the lens of Nickolas Muray." Fifty photographic portraits of Frida Kahlo comprise this exhibition. Thru 9/03/17.

Lancaster Museum of Art and History's (MOAH) current exhibition is the launch for The Mojave Project, a multiyear transmedia project exploring the physical, geological and cultural landscape of the Mojave Desert. "Made in the Mojave" features works by Marthe Aponte, Carol Es, Samantha Fields, Randi Hokett, Aline Mare, Ron Pinkerton, Catherine Ruane, Nicolas Shake and Kim Stringfellow. Thru 7/30/17.

WOMEN OUT OF TOWN:

Nancy Youdelman's "Fashioning a Feminist Vision: 1972-2017" is the current exhibit at the <u>Fresno Art</u> <u>Museum</u>. (All images are by Youdelman). The show is

curated by **Michele Ellis Pracy**, Executive Director and Chief Curator at the museum. Youdelman is one of the pioneers of the Feminist Art Movement and participated in the iconic "WomanHouse."

This retrospective covers 45 years of artistic practice and includes 65 pieces, divided by decade. Clothing plays an important role in her art practice as she incorporates a myriad of objects and materials to transport her memory, identity and feelings. Sculptures in two or three-dimensional assemblages as well as large-scale installations are her means of expression. Vintage clothing and accessories form the materials for her personal and feminist messages. Thru 8/12/17.
